Welcome back everyone! I hope your break was great. It is sure nice to see the sunshine and warmer temperatures. We've still got snow on the playground but it's disappearing fast.





DEAR McLEOD CAREGIVER,

Following up on our past wonderful experiences with this program, we are thrilled to have an opportunity to welcome back another volunteer Japanese "cultural ambassador in-residence" who will introduce the culture, customs and language of Japan to our students.

Masumi Ishikawa would serve as our Japanese teaching assistant from Tokyo. The program enriches our students with the culture, customs and language of Japan and provides a unique cross-cultural experience, focusing on the diversity of world cultures. There is no cost to our school. I can share Masumi's profile if you are interested.

The Opportunity

• International Internship Programs (IIP) is a Tokyo-based international exchange organization that has placed Asian teaching assistants in leading schools across Canada and the U.S for more than 30 years. To date, more than 3,000 schools have hosted a Japanese teaching assistant, enriching their students' lives.

Cross-Cultural Exchange: The program provides our students with a unique opportunity to gain first-hand cross-cultural experience, one that sparks a stronger connection with other countries and the world around us. Our Japanese cultural ambassador will volunteer time, energy and expertise, supporting our staff and enabling our students to learn about Japan, Asia and ways of life different from their own.

<u>Timing</u>: Masumi would arrive to Start the school year in September and remain until March. Host families are needed for part or all of this time.

Host Family

- In order to bring this wonderful opportunity back to our community, we need to identify one or more host families who would enjoy hosting our Japanese teaching assistant.
- Hosting creates a rich, memorable opportunity to experience cultural exchange within your home, learn about Japanese traditions, and make a lifelong friend in Japan.

Existing Policies 505.1 and 505.2

Policy 505.1

Student Records

The Board of Education, School District No. 91 (Nechako Lakes), shall maintain and safeguard student records. The Board will provide copies of records to the student(s) or parents/guardians, subject to statutory limitations and Board regulations. Copies of student records will also be provided to appropriate agencies or institutions in accordance with statutory requirements and Board regulations.

For the purposes of this policy, "Student Record", as defined by the School Act, means: "student record" means a record of information in written or electronic form pertaining to

- (a) a student or francophone student, or
- (b) a child registered under section 13 with a school or a francophone school, but does not include
- (c) a record prepared by a person if that person is the only person with access to the record, or
- (d) a record of a report under section 14 (1) or 16 (3)(b) of the *Child, Family and Community Service Act* or of information that forms the basis for a report under section 14 (1) of that Act;
- Current as of September 30, 2016

The Board of Education, School District No. 91 (Nechako Lakes), recognizes the student's right to privacy and affirms that all student records be treated as confidential. The Board further recommends that very sensitive personal records be retained separately in a confidential file to ensure they cannot be accessed by anyone other than those with a need to know.

For the purpose of this policy, "need to know" means that only those who are directly and actively providing a specific service or performing a professional duty in relation to a student need to know, or require access to all or portions of a student's personal records.

The Board affirms that the collection and use of a student's personal information is for the purposes of planning and administering each student's educational program and meeting the school board's statutory obligations.

Objectives:

- 1. To maintain and safeguard student records.
- 2. To provide controlled access to student records.
- 3. To provide copies of records to students or parents/guardians or to agencies or institutions on behalf of students when appropriate requests are made.
- 4. To maximize the value of student records.

- Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act

Policy 505.2

Access to Student Records by Parents or Students

The Board of Education, School District No. 91 (Nechako Lakes), recognizes that any information or record about or referring to a particular student is considered to be the personal information of the student, to which she/he, and the parents/guardian, have the right of access, when the student is of school age. When the student reaches the age of majority then only he/she has the right of access.

The Board recognizes, however, that access to a record is not absolute and is subject to the provisions the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. There may be circumstances where the school district may withhold personal information from students or their parents if the disclosure of the information could harm the safety or mental or physical health of the student, or of another person.

The Board acknowledges that the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* gives students and their parents the right to appeal the district's decision to the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner.

The procedures for access to student records are specified in the Regulations accompanying this policy.



Combined Policy Proposal:

Policy 505.1

Student Records and Access to Student Records by Parents or Students

The Board of Education (the "Board") affirms that student records are collected and used only for the purposes of:

- o planning and administering each student's educational program, and
- o meeting the Board's statutory obligations.

Student records are defined in the School Act, section 79.

It is the policy of the Board that, subject to statutory limitations and Board regulations:

- o each student has a right to privacy
- o all student records must be treated as confidential
- o each student has the right to access their student records
- the student's parents/guardians have the right to access the student's records only while the student is under the age of majority
- upon request, student records will be provided to the student or the student's parents/guardians
- o copies of student records will also be provided to appropriate agencies or institutions.

The Board recognizes, however, that access to a record is not absolute and is subject to the provisions of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act. There may be circumstances where the School District may withhold personal information from students or their parents if the disclosure of the information could harm the safety and/or mental or physical health of the student, or of another person.
