

Still time to donate for Jump Rope for Heart



Canadian Jewish Heritage Month

A month to celebrate the richness of Jewish culture, heritage, and history in Canada.

Judaism is a religion, but Jews have many different types of religious practices. Not all Jews are religious and, among those who define themselves as religious have different interpretations of Jewish law may guide their religious practice. Jewish prayer is conducted in Hebrew, and Jewish school children typically learn the language as part of their formal Jewish education. May is chosen because it's meaningful to the Jewish community around the world. It often coincides with Shavuot, or the "Feast of Weeks", which celebrates the spring harvest and the revelation of the Torah.
